We believe and want to keep believing that our spouse is the problem, and as a result we close our eyes and ears to their cry and complains. This has never solved any problem and will never solve any problem in your relationship. Take a good look at yourself, and identify the things that offend your spouse that he or she has been crying about all these years. FOCUS ON YOURSELF

"Why do you look at the speck of sawdust in your brother's eye and pay no attention to the plank in your own eye? How can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' when all the time there is a plank in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the plank out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye". (Matt 7:3-5 NIV)

Don't focus on your spouse's weakness, rather, focus on yours. When you work on yourself, God will help you by working on your spouse. First, attend to your person. See yourself as the one with the main and only problem. If you attend to yourself with this mindset, you will make a remarkable change in your life, and this will in turn provoke your partner to make a change in his or her own life.

Change is inevitable if marriage must work smoothly and peace maintained. Change is inevitable if love must be kept fresh and the dream of living together till death is to be realized. If separation and divorce is to be avoided, change when necessary is essential and must not be overlooked. Go to work on yourself now.

KNOW THIS

1. Your experience in life is a product of your faithfulness to God and his instructions.
2. What you were yesterday, what you are today, and what you will be tomorrow are determined by your faithfulness to God.
3. God's blessings in your life are determined by your faithfulness to his instructions.
4. Your level of obedience determines your level of promotion and upliftment in Christ, in business and society.
5. You are the one who chooses the cup with which you are to be blessed - the cup is determined by your level of obedience.
6. You are where you are by choice. And you can also decide to move from where you are. It is a matter of choice.
7. Disobedience is the root of agony and oppression. The devil's attack on you and your marriage will never work when you are in obedience to God's word.

"In righteousness you will be established: Tyranny will be far from you; you will have nothing to fear. Terror will be far removed; it will not come near you. If anyone does attack you, it will not be my doing; whoever attacks you will surrender to you-----no

weapon forged against you will prevail, and you will refute every tongue that accuses you. This is the heritage of the servants of the Lord, and this is their vindication from me, declares the LORD". (Isa. 54:14,15,17)

Walking in righteousness will deliver all these to you. And obedience is the foundation and road of righteous living.

Change brings one into the part of greatness. Change takes you from the wrong way of doing a thing to the right way where success and prosperity is sure.

Change positions you for blessings, while hardness of heart closes the door against you.

DO NOT RESIST CHANGE

To be stiff-necked is to be hard-hearted or to be stubborn and rebellious. If you refuse to bend, you will be broken by God. When He applies a heavy hand to discipline you, you will be bruised badly.

If you do not bend, you will break. Read 1 Cor. 1-13; Prov. 1:20-33. To resist change is to resist progress. To resist change is to resist blessing. To resist change is to resist promotion. To resist change is to resist good and welcome evil and misfortune in your life and family. To resist change is to resist God and his Holy Spirit. To resist Change is to reject truth. To resist change is to reject an open door. To resist change is to resist breakthrough. To resist change is to resist the answer to your prayers. To resist change is to resist peace and harmony in your home. To resist change is an invitation to crisis, separation and divorce.
