

WHEN IS MY DUE SEASON

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“And let us not be weary in well doing for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not”. (Gal. 6:9).

You may be asking,

1. “When am I due for blessings”?
2. According to Mal. 3:10, “When will these windows open”?

Mal 3:10

10 Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the LORD Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that you will not have room enough for it.

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3. According to Eccl. 11:1,2, “What does many days mean”?

Eccl 11:1-2

Cast your bread upon the waters, for after many days you will find it again. 2 Give portions to seven, yes to eight, for you do not know what disaster may come upon the land.

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Every time you give, you’re laying a foundation for the time to come.

Your due season is when your cloud is full. Eccl. 11:3.

Eccl 11:3

3 If clouds are full of water, they pour rain upon the earth. Whether a tree falls to the south or to the north, in the place where it falls, there will it lie.

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You are not due until when your cloud is full! Until you have cast enough up there laying up treasures for yourself in heaven, your rain of blessing will not fall upon you here on earth.

HOW DO I FILL UP MY CLOUDS

Each man plays a principal role in determining his due season. You fill your clouds by casting your bread upon the waters, and when it is due it will rain down blessings for you. Every opportunity to give a SACRIFICE brings you closer to your due season, because it helps to fill up your cloud faster than regular input (offerings). That’s why with every acceptable SACRIFICE. There’s a forceful turn around of destiny. The cloud suddenly becomes full, and the “rain” begins to fall!

Some people have been Christians for 20 years, others have been around for just five years, and they have filled their clouds again and again, and the “rain” just keeps falling time and again for them.

- It is input for output.
- It is evaporation that leads to “raination”.
- If nothing is going up from you, nothing will come down for you!

Every rainy season is a time of refreshing and refreshing answers when your cloud is full. When evaporation is taking place, the earth gets drier and drier. But suddenly (When the water evaporated has condensed and the clouds can no longer contain its weight) the windows of heaven open and it comes back to the earth as rain.

Your due season does not answer to prayer. **Only, after the cloud of you’re GIVING is full, that they empty themselves upon the earth as blessings.** So your programmed efforts should be towards filling up the clouds again and again by giving and giving till the cloud is full. God cannot deny you of your rainfall when you are due - Job 34:10.

The subject of when is the due season for harvest has for long remained a mystery among Christians. People think due season is when God thinks you’re due. No! Your due season is not when you have a need either. Your due season is when you are due. Your due season is determined by your rigorous investments. How much you lay up there in heaven determines when it comes down.

- Your location doesn’t matter. What matters is that you are consistent in sowing your seeds and working hard at your profession as you follow all other biblical principles of success.

1 Kings 3:4-5

4 The king went to Gibeon to offer sacrifices, for that was the most important high place, and Solomon offered a thousand burnt offerings on that altar. 5 At Gibeon the LORD appeared to Solomon during the night in a dream, and God said, "Ask for whatever you want me to give you." NIV

Gen 8:20-9:1

20 Then Noah built an altar to the LORD and, taking some of all the clean animals and clean birds, he sacrificed burnt offerings on it. 21 The LORD smelled the pleasing aroma and said in his heart: "Never again will I curse the ground because of man, even though every inclination of his heart is evil from childhood. And never again will I destroy all living creatures, as I have done.

22:1 Some time later God tested Abraham. He said to him, "Abraham!"

"Here I am," he replied.

2 Then God said, "Take your son, your only son, Isaac, whom you love, and go to the region of Moriah. Sacrifice him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains I will tell you about."

3 Early the next morning Abraham got up and saddled his donkey. He took with him two of his servants and his son Isaac. When he had cut enough wood for the burnt offering, he set out for the place God had told him about. 4 On the third day Abraham looked up and saw the place in the distance. 5 He said to his servants, "Stay here with the donkey while I and the boy go over there. We will worship and then we will come back to you."

6 Abraham took the wood for the burnt offering and placed it on his son Isaac, and he himself carried the fire and the knife. As the two of them went on together, 7 Isaac spoke up and said to his father Abraham, "Father?"

"Yes, my son?" Abraham replied.

"The fire and wood are here," Isaac said, "but where is the lamb for the burnt offering?"

8 Abraham answered, "God himself will provide the lamb for the burnt offering, my son." And the two of them went on together.

9 When they reached the place God had told him about, Abraham built an altar there and arranged the wood on it. He bound his son Isaac and laid him on the altar, on top of the wood.

10 Then he reached out his hand and took the knife to slay his son. 11 But the angel of the LORD called out to him from heaven, "Abraham! Abraham!"

"Here I am," he replied.

12 "Do not lay a hand on the boy," he said. "Do not do anything to him. Now I know that you fear God, because you have not withheld from me your son, your only son."

13 Abraham looked up and there in a thicket he saw a ram caught by its horns. He went over and took the ram and sacrificed it as a burnt offering instead of his son. 14 So Abraham called that place The LORD Will Provide. And to this day it is said, "On the mountain of the LORD it will be provided."

15 The angel of the LORD called to Abraham from heaven a second time 16 and said, "I swear by myself, declares the LORD, that because you have done this and have not withheld your son, your only son, 17 I will surely bless you and make your descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as the sand on the seashore. Your descendants will take possession of the cities of their enemies, 18 and through your offspring all nations on earth will be blessed, because you have obeyed me."

19 Then Abraham returned to his servants, and they set off together for Beersheba. And Abraham stayed in Beersheba.

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Eccl 11:4

*4 Whoever watches the wind will not plant;
whoever looks at the clouds will not reap.*

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WHY DOES GOD APPOINT A DUE SEASON?

1. He wants to know what is in your heart - whether it is God or money. That's why He appoints a due season for your harvest.

Deut 8:2

2 Remember how the LORD your God led you all the way in the desert these forty years, to humble you and to test you in order to know what was in your heart, whether or not you would keep his commands

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2. So that he can be satisfied that you are worthy of the blessings he is bringing your way.

Deut 8:18

18 But remember the LORD your God, for it is he who gives you the ability to produce wealth, and so confirms his covenant, which he swore to your forefathers, as it is today.

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3. God proves you first so that the wealth will not become your wreck.

1 Tim 3:10

10 They must first be tested; and then if there is nothing against them, let them serve as deacons.

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James 1:3-4

3 because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance. 4 Perseverance must finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything.

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Job 23:10

10 But he knows the way that I take; when he has tested me, I will come forth as gold.

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So keep planting your seeds. Give again and again, and don't stop giving. Give to God. Give to your Pastors and men of God. Give to those in need. Sow in the morning. Sow in the evening. Sow every day of your life, and you will have a great harvest.
